TIPS TO PREPARE FOR THE **Interview**



LISTS OF WHAT YOU SHOULD PREPARE
BEFORE GOING TO THE REAL INTERVIEW:

1. Do a research

First, ask yourself of what you want to do in the future. Then, find the program/ faculty that best suits your needs. Make sure you know whether the objectives of the program/ faculty benefit you and match your needs.

2. Bring your portfolio (if you have)

Be prepared to answer questions regarding your experience, skills and achievements. Interviewers would like to ensure you can successfully graduate, so your past achievements can prove that you are one of the best candidates!

3. Prepare a set of questions

At the end of the interview, interviewers usually ask you to ask some questions. Try to ask questions that show you're passionate about this opportunity.

4. Set your attitude

You want to apply to this program/ faculty because you want to learn, so it is acceptable if you cannot answer some questions. Do not panic, it's fine to say "I don't know", but you should mention that you are eager to know more if you have an opportunity to study here.

5. Practice makes perfect

Practicing in front of the mirror allows you to observe many skills, including body language and facial expressions. Also, try to anticipate possible questions or ask experienced people to help you practicing.

Most common interview questions

1. Introduce yourself

Start with a polite greeting, state your full name, mention your educational background and relevant extra curricular activities, highlight key skills and strengths, briefly share your study objective, and express gratitude for the opportunity.

2. Why choosing (this Univ)? Why not (other Univ)?

Be honest. You might visit the campus or talk to current students and/or alumni and then bring something into your answer. You can also match your personality or need with the university of your choice.

3. What other universities have you applied to?

It is important to answer this question honestly and respectfully. It is perfectly acceptable to mention other programs that you have applied to, but it is important to emphasize that you are excited about each program for different reasons and that you have done your research on each program.

4. What are your future goals?

The most successful candidates are the ones whose ultimate aims align with those of the area of study, even if they don't plan to spend their entire career working in the same industry. However, you should aim for careers in similar industries to show that you are really interested in this area of study but can switch to similar ones if uncertainty happens.

5. What are your strengths and weaknesses?

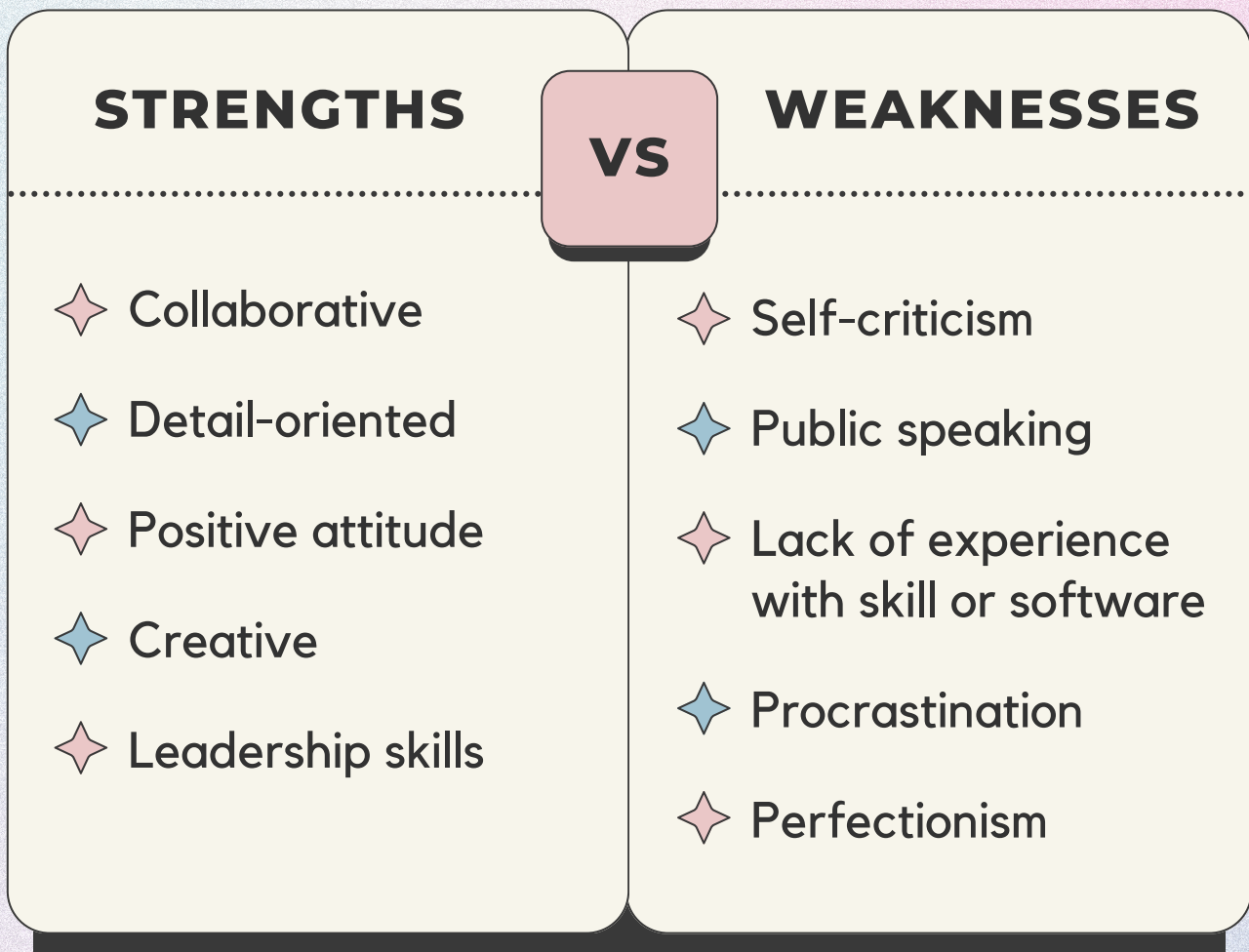
6. Which adjective/ word that best describes yourself?

7. Do you have any question?

Try to ask questions that show you're passionate about this opportunity. It's also a way to demonstrate that you are engaged during the interview. Do not ask a question which already has an answer on the website e.g. "do you offer a scholarship/ an exchange program?" but ask for something you are really interested in but find no clue on the website.

✓ DO'S

- Try to "explain" and/or "give example" to support your answer e.g. "My positive attitude is definitely one of my strengths. I have been a tutor, so I can view a situation from multiple perspectives and empathize with my students to understand their needs."
- When mentioning a weakness, please also add "a solution" e.g. "Procrastination has long been a bad habit of mine. I think it stems from a fear of failure, but I started using Google Calendar to manage my time better. Crossing things off my to-do list makes me feel accomplished."

✗ DON'TS

- Don't say something without explanation
- Don't say "I have no weakness"
